Elephant procession

9am at Wat Mai

The elephant procession begins its journey from Wat Mai, a monastery with a rich history and special significance. For centuries, it has been a sacred temple for the royal family and has served as the home of the Phra Sangkharat, the highest Buddhist dignitary in Laos.

From Wat Mai, the majestic elephants will make their way to Wat Xieng Thong, also known as the 'Golden Tree Monastery'. This stunning temple is strategically located near the confluence of the Mekong and Nam Khan rivers, making it a gateway to the beautiful city of Luang Prabang.

Together, these two temples represent the deep spiritual and cultural heritage of Laos, and the procession of elephants between them is a symbol of the country's rich history and traditions.

Muu Sangkhan Luang

6am at the Village Market Fair

In preparation for the New Year, the Village Market Fair (Lolat) will be set up on the main street between the Old Stadium grounds and the Royal Palace, a route known as 'cleaning day' or Muu Sangkhan Luang.

This day is filled with symbolic rituals of purification, and the fair offers a chance for guests to enjoy traditional foods, crafts and other goods. It is a vibrant and lively celebration not to be missed.

Sand stupa making

1pm at Hatsai Moungkhoun

Experience the unique tradition of sand stupa making in Hatsai Moungkhoun, Mekong River Island in the charming village of Xiengman.

After a boat ride to the island, join villagers in creating intricate sand stupas. Skilled artisans will guide you through the process, teaching you techniques and symbolism while using colourful sands and other materials to construct each stupa.

Prepare to be fully immersed in the sights, sounds and aromas of Laos' New Year celebrations as locals play music, light incense and offer prayers to the Buddha.

City tour

7pm

Experience the city by night and join in water pouring ceremonies cleansing Buddha statues at various temples to gain New Year blessings.

5.30am at the Outing Gate



Lao Barbecue Dinner

7.30pm at the Main Pool

Relive each atmospheric moment of your day beside Amantaka's serene swimming pool as you settle in for a barbecue feast beneath the stars.

The evening's menu showcases Lao barbecue specialties from buffalo with jungle herbs to fish fresh from the Mekong. Herbs are picked from Amantaka's own garden and other seasonal ingredients are hand selected from the town's exceptional farmer's markets. Sample savoury dishes such as khao jee (baguette with spiced tomato and eggplant relish), Luang Prabang sausage and tam mak hung (green papaya salad), and finally kanon krok – traditional coconut rice pancakes with pandan coconut sauce.
