## Amanera

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Located on the north coast of the Dominican Republic, Amanera overlooks the golden sands of Playa Grande beach and the Atlantic Ocean. Offering 25-casitas and private Aman Villas to own, the resort rests alongside the clifftop fairways of the private Playa Grande Golf & Ocean Club, and features multiple dining venues, an Aman Spa and a Beach Club.

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Overlooking the Atlantic Ocean and Playa Grande beach, Amanera is framed by dramatic mountains on the north coast of the Dominican Republic. Offering multiple dining venues, an Aman Spa, Beach Club and private Aman Villas to own, the 25-casita resort also provides exclusive access to the neighbouring fairways of Playa Grande Golf & Ocean Club. Originally designed by Robert Trent Jones Sr, the golf course has been fully renovated by his son, Rees Jones. An idyllic escape, Amanera also offers kite surfing, deep-sea fishing and horse riding.

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Perched on the Dominican Republic's north coast, Amanera overlooks the golden sands of Playa Grande beach, backed by pristine jungle and a dramatic mountain range. Offering breathtaking Atlantic Ocean views, the property's name combines the Sanskrit-derived word for 'peace' with *era*, the word for 'water' in Taíno. The 25-casita property lies alongside the spectacular clifftop fairways of the private Playa Grande Golf & Ocean Club. Originally created by golfing legend Robert Trent Jones Sr, the 18-hole course was recently updated by his son, Rees Jones.

Perched atop 60-foot cliffs at the western end of Playa Grande beach, Amanera offers extensive dining, spa and recreational facilities. Designed to maximise the extraordinary views, each of the 24 one-bedroom, freestanding Casitas enjoys unobstructed ocean vistas from an expansive terrace. Every Casita is accessed via a winding pathway through a private garden, and 14 have private 10-metre swimming pools. The two-bedroom Bay View Casita enjoys one of the finest settings on the property, with panoramic views of the ocean and Playa Grande beach, a 20-metre infinity pool and a private footpath down to the sand.

The property's main pavilion, Casa Grande, appears to float above a three-tiered water feature, its elevated position providing sweeping panoramas of ocean, fairway and jungle at every turn. It houses the bar and lounge, a discreet reception, a library and a convivial cigar bar, and leads to Amanera's signature restaurant with its indoor and outdoor dining areas. Beyond the restaurant is the main swimming pool. The informal Beach Club is tucked into a sandy cove on Playa Grande beach and offers a casual dining area, water sports equipment and a children's club.

Demonstrating a raw, organic design, these 25 freestanding structures appear to emerge from the jungle, their clean, modernist lines allowing for biodiverse green roofs and cool, contemporary living spaces that blur the lines between dwelling and jungle.

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True to the property's intrinsic connection with *era* – water – the property's main pavilion, Casa Grande, appears to float above a three-tiered water feature, its elevated position providing sweeping panoramas of ocean, fairway and jungle at every turn. It houses the bar and lounge, a discreet reception, a library and a convivial cigar bar, and leads to Amanera's signature restaurant with its indoor and outdoor dining areas. Beyond the restaurant is the main swimming pool.
