Perched on the northern hillside is the Aman Spa, which offers an enriching selection of holistic wellness facilities and treatments. Palm-lined sandy paths lead to a selection of dining venues including the Beach Club, Japanese restaurant Nama, the Picnic Grove, and the Club House with its bar and terrace overlooking the main swimming pool. Seasonal menus highlight fresh ingredients from the island's flourishing organic farm.

Other facilities include the Sea Sports Hut offering a variety of water sports equipment and cruising options, the Padi Dive Centre, the Kite and Surf Centre, and the West Villa Clubhouse for bespoke events.

Outdoor relaxation salas claim mesmerising sea views, while the Spa's fitness pavilion houses the yoga studio, gym, Pilates pavilion, hydrotherapy suites and a finishing salon. Fitness specialists are on hand to provide guidance, and the Jungle Run obstacle course and four tennis courts provide further scope for outdoor activity.

Palm-lined sandy pathways lead to a selection of seasonal dining venues, with fresh ingredients sourced from the island's flourishing organic farm. On a gentle rise sits the Clubhouse with its open-air terrace and bar overlooking the main swimming pool. Open all day and throughout the year, it serves Filipino favourites and Southeast Asian-inspired fare. On the western side of the island is the Beach Club – ideal for relaxed all-day Mediterranean dining and watching the sunset year-round. The Lagoon Club on the island's east coast is home to Nama, serving fine Japanese washoku cuisine including

sushi and sashimi from November to May. For casual toes-in-the-sand dining, the Picnic Grove and the Windsurf Hut serve a variety of wood-fired pizzas from November to May and June to October respectively.

Other facilities include the Sea Sports Hut offering a variety of water sports equipment and cruising options, the Padi Dive Centre, the Kite and Surf Centre, and the West Villa Clubhouse for bespoke events.
