Part of Moyo-Satonda National Park, this untouched mother nature reigns across the 36,000 hectares in the coral-rich Flores Sea.

A veritable Eden in the Flores Sea. Overlooking the turquoise waters of Amanwana Bay – a National Park – this wilderness hideaway offers unparalleled access to some of the best scuba diving and snorkelling in Indonesia. Here in this wildlife lover's paradise, Amanwana has set up camp, with 17 safari tents amid the rainforest or on the shore.

Locations

- Moyo Island lies just east of Bali, facing Sumbawa Island, at the western end of the Nusa Tenggara archipelago
- Amanwana is tucked into a secluded cove on the island's west coast, looking out to the Flores Sea

Getting There

- Travel by air to Sultan Muhammad Kaharuddin III Airport (SWQ) at Sumbawa Besar, then 50 minutes by boat from Badas Harbour to Moyo Island.
- A private charter plane can be arranged and provided by JetSet. Departing from Bali – Ngurah Rai International Airport (DPS) to Sumbawa Besar - Sultan Muhammad Kaharuddin III Airport (SWQ).
- A private helicopter, partnering with Wise Air, departing from Bali directly to Amanwana resort ground on Moyo Island can also be arranged.

- Return car and boat transfer from Sumbawa Besar's Sultan Muhammad Kaharuddin III Airport (SWQ) to Moyo Island
- Breakfast, lunch, and dinner with soft beverages

Experiences

From land to sea, Amanwana is surrounded by abundant wildlife and offers plenty of ways to explore the pristine natural setting.

Waterfall Excursion

Comprising a series of cascading limestone pools, Barry's Falls is located in the centre of Moyo Island. Named after Amanwana's Resident Naturalist, Barry Lees, who discovered Amanwana Bay, and in turn found this beautiful waterfall in the early 1990s, Barry's Falls is also known as Mata Jitu Waterfall. Its crystal-clear water is heavenly and provides an opportunity for a refreshing dip in its limestone pools, an experience to take home and cherish.

Cruising

Much of what enthralls guests during a stay at Amanwana is the ability to completely unwind. There are few better places to do so than on a leisurely cruise, taking in the best that nature has to offer. With 3 private vessels, venture out to the vast sea for either a sunset cruise or a starlight cruise, all are possibilities while at Amanwana.

Turtle Street

Protected inside Amanwana's Bay, guests can find several resident hawksbill and green sea turtles around this gently sloping reef.

Also to be seen are anemone fish, nudibranchs, lobsters, moray eels, and black-tip reef sharks. The remains of an old Jeep make for a good photo opportunity.

Bakela Feast Dinner

Bakela means 'sharing from one platter' in the local language. Featuring some local dishes, served in a lesehan picnic style (low tables and mat seating) and surrounded by flickering lanterns from Siong Sira to Singang, the dinner is a celebration of diverse Sumbawanese cuisine.

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
