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# Welcome to Amanemu

Resting on an emerald-green hillside in Ise-Shima National Park, the ryokan-inspired onsen resort of Amanemu offers guests a serene retreat for restorative peace. The resort's name is drawn from 'aman', the Sanskrit-derived word for peace, and 'nemu', meaning to share joy in Japanese. Guests can enjoy bespoke Aman Journeys seeking out the cultural nuances and finest experiences of the region.

Whether celebrating a milestone birthday, anniversary or simply gathering with friends, Amanemu provides numerous ways to create memories.

For those seeking a family feast, several private dining locations are available, while for a more intimate occasion, cocktails in a private bay offer a romantic way to celebrate as day turns to dusk. Amanemu's dedicated team is also on hand to create more robust itineraries, with activities such as onsen bathing and hiking in the national park encouraging reconnection as part of a longer stay.

Certain aspects of a celebration require specialist services, and Amanemu works with trusted professionals who are known for their expertise.



# Location

Amanemu's breathtaking location encourages relaxation and contemplation. Surrounded by the protected forests of Ise Shima National Park, Amanemu lies on the Osaki Peninsula in Mie Prefecture – an area boasting a thousand kilometres of Pacific coastline. Overlooking Ago Bay, also known as the Bay of Pearls, the resort is close to Japan's most sacred Shinto shrines and forested pilgrimage routes.

The resort is easily accessible by car from all directions, and regular trains run from Nagoya, Kyoto and Osaka to Kashikojima station. It takes about 120 minutes by train from Nagoya Station, and approximately 150 minutes by train from Osaka Namba or Kyoto Station.





# Getting Here

## From Tokyo, Osaka or Kyoto by Train

For guests travelling from the capital, the journey from Tokyo Station to Nagoya Station is approximately 95 minutes by bullet trains. On arrival at Nagoya Station, guests will need to transfer to a local Kintetsu train for 120 minutes, bound for Kashikojima Station. From Osaka Namba or Kyoto station, there are regular Kintetsu trains which take approximately 150 minutes to Kashikojima Station. From the station gate, guests will be welcomed by a driver for complimentary transfer to Amanemu.

## Airport Transfers

Amanemu's limousine service can be arranged for seamless, direct airport transfers. Guests can also take a train to or from the airport to Kashikojima Station, just a 20-minute drive from Amanemu. Complimentary transfers are offered to and from the station.

## Private Travel

Guest may also choose to travel in private car from Nagoya, Osaka or Kyoto directly to Amanemu. About 150 minutes journey from Nagoya, and approximately 210 minutes journey from Osaka or Kyoto. Alongside limousine transfers from various locations, a private helicopter service can also be arranged, arriving on Amanemu's very own landing spot.

## International Flights

The nearest airport to Amanemu is Chubu Centrair International Airport (NGO), located about three hours by car or a quick 25-minute helicopter ride away. Direct flights to NGO are available from several international cities, including Helsinki, Seoul, Beijing, Shanghai, Hong Kong, Taipei, Singapore, Manila, Bangkok and Hanoi.

Identical in layout and design, Amanemu's 99-square-metre (1,065 square foot) Suites present combined bedroom and living areas with woven textile shutters opening to embrace the outdoors. Expansive decks offer outdoor living area and beautiful views. Suites are divided into three different categories depending on their outlooks: Mori Suites are surrounded by indigenous vegetation with tranquil green views; Sora Suites are situated closer to the coast with peaceful green views towards Ago Bay; closest to the shore, Nagi Suites boast premium views of Ago Bay.

# Sunken Terrace

## Wellness & Fitness

Heavily influenced by the abundance of natural hot springs and therapeutic powers of water, the resort's 2,000 square metre spa encompasses a large central onsen for bathing, plus two private spa pavilions with their own indoor and outdoor onsen, perfect for relaxing after or preparing for a wedding or event.

## Wellness From Water

Japan has understood the healing power of mineral bathing since the days of the shogunate, when samurai would use onsen to restore their health and recover from the rigours of battle. As well as aiding in recovery from fatigue and injury and relieving pain, onsen bathing can improve general wellbeing. Enjoy the same restorative benefits as the samurai, with sessions in Amanemu spa's mineral-rich pools.

## Thermal-Spring Therapy

The onsen pools of the Amanemu Spa are fed by a nearby hot spring, which provides water that is naturally rich in healing minerals – the perfect complement to any spa therapy. Daybeds are positioned around the thermal spring garden, and two separate onsen pavilions provide space to take to the waters in comfort and privacy.

# Experiences & Excursions

## Ise Shima National Park

The protected forests surrounding Amanemu offer extensive walking and cycling trails. Each season offers a different experience, from pink Sakura cherry blossoms in spring to vibrant red maple leaves in autumn.

## Ise Jingu

Ise Jingu is Japan's holiest site – an awe-inspiring Shinto shrine dating back 2,000 years. The shrine, meticulously rebuilt every two decades, is set within sprawling, deeply serene woodland. The naiku inner shrine is home to the sun goddess Amaterasu-omikami.

## Kumano Kodo

These ancient, UNESCO-protected pilgrimage routes crisscross the Kii Peninsula, winding through forests of soaring cedar trees. Amanemu offers one-day private excursions taking in the major sacred sites.

## Golf Above the Bay

Neighbouring Amanemu, the 18-hole Nemu Golf Club enjoys one of the most beautiful settings in Japan. The sweeping greens overlook the drama of the bay below, and offer golfers the opportunity to tackle challenging shots over the coastal inlets, as well as a driving range with natural grass tees, some of which are covered for all-weather play.
