

Amangiri

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Surrounded by the starkly beautiful desert scenery of North America's canyon country, Amangiri is situated on 600 acres in southern Utah. Built around a central swimming pool, the resort blends into its dramatic surroundings, offering 34 suites, a four-bedroom home and an extensive Aman Spa, all with spectacular views.

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Surrounded by the starkly beautiful desert scenery of North America's canyon country, Amangiri ('peaceful mountain') occupies 600 acres in Canyon Point, southern Utah, close to the border with Arizona. The resort is tucked into a protected valley with sweeping views towards the Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument. Constructed around a central swimming pool, the architecture blends into its dramatic surroundings, offering 34 suites, a four-bedroom home and an extensive Aman Spa with a dedicated floatation therapy pavilion.

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Surrounded by the starkly beautiful desert scenery of North America's canyon country, Amangiri ('peaceful mountain') occupies 600 acres in Canyon Point, southern Utah, close to the border with Arizona. The resort is tucked into a protected valley with sweeping views towards the Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument. Constructed around a central swimming pool, Amangiri's contemporary architecture blends imperceptibly into its dramatic surroundings, offering 34 suites and a four-bedroom home. The resort's expansive Aman Spa features a floatation therapy pavilion, a water pavilion – with sauna, steam room, a cold plunge pool and step pool – a gym and a yoga pavilion.

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Amangiri ('peaceful mountain') lies at the centre of the USA's Grand Circle, surrounded by the Grand Canyon, Monument Valley, and Bryce and Zion National Parks. Boasting some of the country's most dramatic scenery, this ancient landscape of deep canyons and towering plateaus – the last remnants of truly wild America – is home to the native Navajo tribe.

Situated on 243 hectares (600 acres) in Canyon Point, southern Utah, Amangiri's concrete structure appears hewn from the rocks. Contemporary and minimalist, the bold design showcases the incredible scenery: windows frame ancient mesas and breathtaking desert skies, and the main swimming pool curves around a dramatic stone escarpment. Guests arrive via a winding road that leads to the property's central Pavilion, from where vistas unfold towards the Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument. Built around the main pool, the Pavilion houses the Dining Room, which opens onto an outdoor dining terrace overlooking the pool; the Living Room; a library;

gallery; private dining room; and a cellar. Beyond the Pavilion, the open-air Desert Lounge offers a relaxing space for enjoying sunsets and stargazing. A number of open-air venues – the Fireside Pavilion, the Chinle Site, Saddle Landing and Raven's Nest – are available for private dining and events.

Two accommodation wings spread from the Pavilion towards the desert. Air-conditioned in summer, heated in winter, each of the 34 suites enjoys sweeping views from a spacious deck, and many offer private pools and roof terraces. The four-bedroom Mesa Home enjoys complete seclusion, with full access to all the resort's facilities.

A destination in itself, ideal for wellness retreats, Amangiri's Aman Spa covers 2,322 square metres (25,000 square feet). Facilities include a water pavilion for hydrotherapy treatments; a floatation-therapy pavilion and a watsu pool; five treatment rooms; two outdoor treatment terraces; a finishing salon; a yoga pavilion; and a comprehensive gym.

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Amangiri ('peaceful mountain') lies at the centre of the USA's Grand Circle, surrounded by the iconic sights of the Grand Canyon, Monument Valley, and Bryce and Zion National Parks. Boasting some of the country's most dramatic scenery, its deep canyons and towering plateaus – the last remnants of truly wild America – have for centuries been home to the native Navajo tribe.

Situated on 243 hectares (600 acres) in Canyon Point, southern Utah, Amangiri is a 25-minute drive from the nearest town of Page, Arizona, and 15 minutes from the shores of Lake Powell. Contemporary and minimalist, the resort's extraordinary concrete facade appears hewn from the rocks. Inside, the design turns the focus on the incredible scenery: windows frame ancient mesas and breathtaking desert skies, and the main swimming pool curves around a dramatic stone escarpment. Guests arrive via a winding road that descends into the valley and leads to the property's central Pavilion, from where sweeping views unfold towards the Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument. Built around the main pool, the Pavilion houses the Dining Room, the Living Room, a library, gallery, private dining room and a cellar. Beyond the Pavilion lies the open-air Desert Lounge, a special place from which to enjoy the beauty of the sunset or the starlit sky. A number of other open-air venues across the Amangiri estate – the Fireside Pavilion, the Chinle Site, Saddle Landing and Raven's Nest – are available for private dining and events.

From the Pavilion, two accommodation wings spread outwards towards the desert, housing Amangiri's 34 suites. Air-conditioned in summer, heated in winter, each enjoys far-reaching desert vistas from a spacious deck, and many offer private pools and roof terraces. The four-bedroom Mesa Home enjoys complete seclusion, with full access to all the resort's facilities.

Open for breakfast, lunch and dinner, the Dining Room features floor-to-ceiling glass doors, which open onto the outdoor dining terrace overlooking the swimming pool. The focal point of the Dining Room is the open kitchen, its

wood-fired oven imbuing Amangiri's Southwestern-influenced cuisine with unique flavours and rustic authenticity. Opposite the open kitchen are the private dining room and the wine cellar.

The Living Room takes up two spacious alcoves of the Pavilion, each with cosy seating areas gathered around a wood-burning fireplace. Occupying an elevated plinth in the centre of the Pavilion is the library, its extended sofas punctuated with ledges packed with books and magazines to indulge the curious. The gallery showcases the region's best art, jewellery and handicrafts, including works from the Navajo community.

A destination in itself and an inspirational setting for wellness retreats, Amangiri's Aman Spa covers 2,322 square metres (25,000 square feet) and provides a serene setting for relaxation and rejuvenation. The design incorporates a water pavilion for hydrotherapy treatments; a floatation-therapy pavilion; and a watsu pool built into the rockface. Therapies take place across five walnut-lined treatment rooms, or outdoors on private terraces, surrounded by the desert panorama. A finishing salon, a yoga pavilion and a comprehensive gym complete Amangiri's impressive wellness facility.
