Built on water and synonymous with romance, Venice is famed for its canals, the largest of which – the Grand Canal – is overlooked by the regal 16th-century palazzo that houses Aman Venice. Presenting 24 guestrooms and suites, many with historic architectural details, the hotel also offers two private gardens.

Built on water and synonymous with romance, Venice is famed for its canals, the largest of which – the Grand Canal – winds its way through the heart of the city. Lining this historic thoroughfare are more than 170 gracious buildings, including the regal 16th-century palazzo in which Aman Venice is housed. Presenting 24 guestrooms and suites, many with picturesque views of the Grand Canal, the hotel also offers a breathtaking piano nobile and two private gardens – unusual features in this floating city.

Built on water and synonymous with romance, Venice and its lagoon are listed as a Unesco World Heritage Site. The most famous of Venice's waterways is the Grand Canal, lined with 170 gracious buildings, each between 200 and 700 years old. It is in one of these regal old palazzos that the 24-suite Aman Venice resides today.

Built in the 16th century, Palazzo Papadopoli offers an unusual feature for Venice – two beautiful gardens. Guests usually arrive by boat, docking at a landing that leads directly into the palazzo's Reception Hall. From here, a sweeping staircase rises through two levels to the piano nobile, the grandest floor of any palazzo. At the top of the stairs, the vestibule leads to an elegant lounge with a balcony overlooking the Grand Canal in what was once the ballroom. Adjacent to the ballroom, the Blue Dining Room and the Yellow Dining Room both serve Italian cuisine; the latter overlooks the Grand Canal and features a ceiling painted by the 19th-century artist Cesare Rotta. Also overlooking the Grand Canal, the Bar offers a warm and inviting gathering space.

Rising from the vestibule is a second staircase that leads to the fourth level of the palazzo. This houses the Salon, a lofty-ceilinged lounge with a grand piano and views of the Grand Canal. Also on this level are Stanza del Tiepolo, the games room; and Stanza del Guarana, the meeting room, together with a library.

Aman Venice presents a total of 24 guestrooms and suites, almost all with beautiful views of the Grand Canal. Many feature protected frescoes, and reliefs that reflect past periods of art and architecture. Furniture and furnishings throughout the rooms are contemporary yet redolent of the palazzo's grand history.

Additional facilities include a small spa, a gym and an intimate roof terrace.

Built on water and synonymous with romance, the city of Venice, in northeast Italy, was built atop 118 small islands separated by winding canals. The entire city and its lagoon are listed as a Unesco World Heritage Site – and the most famous of its waterways is the Grand Canal. Meandering in a sinuous S-shape through the heart of the city, it is lined with 170 gracious buildings, each between 200 and 700 years old. It is one of these regal old *palazzos* that the 24-suite Aman Venice resides today.

Built in the 16th century, Palazzo Papadopoli offers an unusual feature for Venice – two beautiful gardens, alive with the gentle sounds of water all about. Guests usually arrive at the property by boat, docking at a landing that leads directly into the palazzo's Reception Hall. Imbued with a sense of bygone opulence with its soaring ceilings and historic frescoes, the atmospheric hall leads directly to the private gardens and a boutique specialising in Venetian glassware.

From the Reception Hall, a sweeping staircase rises through two levels to the piano nobile, the grandest floor of any palazzo. At the top of the stairs, the Vestibule leads to an elegant lounging area with a balcony and beautiful views of the Grand Canal in what was once the ballroom. Adjacent to the ballroom are two separate dining rooms, both serving Italian cuisine: the Blue Dining Room, with its impressive fireplace, and the Yellow Dining Room, which has views over the Grand Canal and features a ceiling painted by renowned 19th-century artist Cesare Rotta. Also overlooking the Grand Canal, the newly refurbished Bar offers a warm and inviting gathering space.

Rising from the Vestibule is a second staircase that leads to the fourth level of the palazzo. This houses the Salon, a regal, lofty-ceilinged lounge and relaxation area with a grand piano and arresting views of the Grand Canal. Also on this level are Stanza del Tiepolo, (the games room) and Stanza del Guarana (the meeting room), together with a library.

Accessed via stairs and a lift, Aman Venice's intimate roof terrace offers panoramic views of the city's rooftops and, on a clear day, the Alps. Other

alfresco venues include the Canal Garden, which fronts the Grand Canal, and the Private Garden, from where guests can wander into the historic neighbourhood of San Polo.

Aman Venice presents a total of 24 guestrooms and suites, almost all with beautiful views of the Grand Canal. Most have a unique layout and design, and many feature protected frescoes and reliefs that reflect past periods of art and architecture. Furniture and furnishings throughout the rooms are contemporary, yet redolent of the palazzo's storied past.

The spa is located on the third level and is accessed via a private staircase. It exudes the atmosphere of a secret sanctuary, providing three single treatment rooms, each with a dressing area and bathroom. There is also a small gym on the fourth level, offering commanding views of the city's skyline.
