Serenity in Central Java's cultural heartland, perfectly placed for exploring historic and natural attractions or simply unwinding in peaceful surroundings. Framed by emerald rice fields and the Menoreh Hills, Amanjiwo overlooks Borobudur. Inspired by the sacred monument, this temple-like retreat features a domed roof, colonnades, and blush-beige paras stone.

LOCATION

The fifth-largest island of the Indonesian archipelago and the most populous which is filled with an abundance of history of various cultures, Java lies between Sumatra and Bali, with the Java Sea to the north, and the Indian Ocean to the south. The lush landscape surrounding Amanjiwo is volcanic and ruggedly beautiful, and the area, scattered with temples and ruins is considered Indonesia's cultural heartland.

TRAIN JOURNEY

Board the regal Kereta Api Wisata train from the lounge at Jakarta-Gambir Station or Pasar Senen Station, and embark on a 7-hour journey through spectacular scenery accompanied by Amanjiwo's Resident Anthropologists, Patrick Vanhoebrouck or Jean-Pascal Elbaz

- Board from the Kereta Api Indonesia VIP Lounge of Jakarta Gambir Station or Pasar Senen Station
- A 7-hour journey with 4 stops through Cirebon, Purwokerto, Kebumen, and Kutoarjo
- Arriving at Yogyakarta Tugu Station, which is known as one of the oldest train stops in Indonesia.

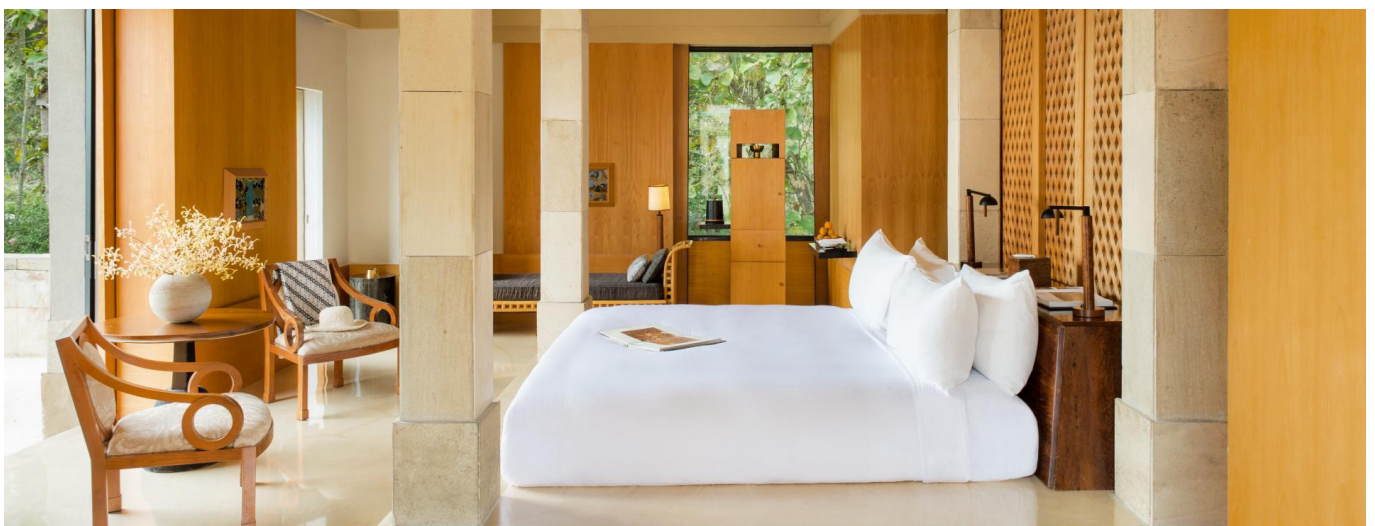
