

Amandayan

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Amandayan is situated on a hilltop in China's fabled city of Lijiang, with expansive views of the UNESCO-protected Old Town and the mountains all around. Housed in a series of dwellings overlooking courtyards, the 35-suite resort offers three restaurants, a cinema and an Aman Spa with swimming pool.

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Situated in China's fabled city of Lijiang, Amandayan rests atop Lion Hill with expansive views of the mountains and the UNESCO-protected Old Town. The property's name combines the Sanskrit-derived word for 'peace' with Dayan, the historic name for Lijiang when it was first established by the ruling Mu family in the 13th century. Arranged around peaceful courtyards and housed in a series of dwellings, the 35-suite resort offers three restaurants, a cinema and an Aman Spa with swimming pool.

Listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1997, the Old Town is overlooked by Amandayan, a two-hectare property that sits atop Lion Hill. The resort's name combines the Sanskrit-derived word for 'peace' with Dayan, the historic name for Lijiang when it was first established by the ruling Mu family in the 13th century.

Designed in the traditional architectural style of the indigenous Naxi, Amandayan is housed in a series of dwellings arranged around peaceful courtyards. There are 34 Suites and one two-bedroom Amandayan villa. Upstairs Suites offer terraces with mountain, and courtyard views, while downstairs Suites open onto tranquil courtyards.

The resort offers three dining venues. The Chinese restaurant, Man Yi Xuan, includes four private rooms and serves Yunnan cuisine for lunch and dinner. Tea House serves afternoon tea, Western bistro style lunch, dinner and bar, and offers both indoor and outdoor settings with breathtaking views of the 800-year-old ancient town. The Lounge serves breakfast, with à la carte or set menus in Western and Chinese style, and local specialties.

The Aman Spa at Amandayan is set around the swimming pool. Each treatment room offers a tranquil relaxation area. Three couple treatment rooms and two single treatment rooms feature wooden bathtubs. Drawing on the teachings of traditional Chinese medicine, the spa menu offers massages, facials, scrubs and wraps. There are fitness facilities too, including a gym and a yoga studio.

The library offers a broad range of reading materials in several languages. Situated close to the library, the Man Yi Ge can be arranged in several different configurations to seat up to 50 individuals. The resort also offers a private cinema with 30 reclining leather seats.

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Lijiang is a fabled city, tucked into the northwestern corner of China's Yunnan Province, renowned as one of the most beautiful places in China. Surrounded by regal peaks including the snow-capped Jade Dragon Snow Mountain and home to a harmonious fusion of cultures. The Old Town of Lijiang, which has a history of over 800 years, was inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List in 1997.

Set atop Lion Hill in the heart of Lijiang, Amandayan is set on a two-hectare property above the picturesque lanes of the Old Town – described by UNESCO as ‘an urban landscape of outstanding quality’. The resort’s name combines the Sanskrit-derived word for ‘peace’ with Dayan, the historic name for Lijiang when it was first established by the ruling Mu family in the 13th century.

Designed in the traditional architectural style of the Naxi – the indigenous people of northwestern Yunnan – Amandayan is housed in a series of dwellings arranged around peaceful courtyards. There are 34 Suites and one two-bedroom Amandayan villa. Suites are 72 square metres and offer spacious bathrooms and comfortable lounging areas. Traditional materials and fabrics have been incorporated throughout, ensuring that the Suites convey a sense of place with subtlety and style.

The resort offers three dining venues. The Chinese restaurant, Man Yi Xuan, includes four private rooms and serves authentic Yunnan cuisine, with an emphasis on seasonal products: featuring organic meats, locally grown vegetables and wild mushrooms. From midday until evening, the Tea House offers an array of indoor and outdoor spaces perfect for dining, scenic enjoyment, and unparalleled relaxation. As night falls, the Bar of Tea House Bistro comes alive with a vibrant yet serene ambiance, featuring live music, handcrafted Chinese tea-inspired cocktails and fine wines.

The Aman Spa at Amandayan is set around the swimming pool. Each treatment room offers a tranquil relaxation area. Three couple treatment rooms and two single treatment rooms feature wooden bathtubs. Drawing on the teachings of traditional Chinese medicine, the spa menu offers massages, facials, scrubs and wraps. There are fitness facilities too, including a gym and a yoga studio.

The library offers a wide selection of reading material on various subjects in several languages, along with quiet areas for Chess, Go and Chinese Chess. Close to the library and perfectly suited to meetings and private functions, the Man Yi Ge can be arranged in a few different configurations to seat up to 50 individuals. The resort's private cinema, with 30 reclining leather seats and a 42.5-square-metre screen, is ideal both for movies and business presentations. There is also a boutique showcasing a variety of local handicrafts, silk embroidery, jewellery and artwork.
