

Amanvari

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Situated on the serene shores of Baja's East Cape, Mexico, Amanvari draws its name from the Sanskrit-derived words for 'peace' and 'water'. Resting in harmony with nature, the tranquil retreat comprises a collection of secluded Casitas and Villas where the distinct landscapes of desert, ocean and estuary converge.

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Located on the serene shores of Baja's East Cape, Mexico, Amanvari takes its name from the Sanskrit-derived words for 'peace' and 'water'. In harmony with nature where desert, ocean and estuary converge, the tranquil retreat comprises a collection of secluded Casitas and Villas fronted by the Sea of Cortés and embraced by the Sierra de la Laguna mountains.

At its heart, the open-air Casa Grande is home to a collection of dining venues, showcasing fresh, local ingredients, alongside an oceanfront beach club and panoramic pool. An expansive Aman Spa draws on the region's healing traditions, with a contemporary *Temazcal* (sweat lodge) among its restorative offerings, while access to the wild beauty of the East Cape invites exploration by land and sea.

Where desert, ocean and estuary converge, the resort rests in harmony with its surroundings, overlooking the shifting blues of the Sea of Cortés and enveloped by the peaks of the Sierra de la Laguna mountains.

Designed by Heah & Co. and realised by Elastic Architects, Amanvari exemplifies Aman's philosophy of sensitive design that merges with its environment. The resort's 18 Casitas are discreetly positioned across the landscape, each offering sweeping views, expansive terraces, private pools and seamless indoor-outdoor living. Interiors draw on the tones and textures of the terrain, with sand-hued textiles, natural stone and local hardwoods complemented by bespoke creations by local artisans.

At the heart of the resort, the open-air Casa Grande atrium is home to a collection of signature and local dining venues that span Italian, Japanese and Baja-inspired cuisine, alongside a laidback beach club and panoramic ocean-view pool. Here, locally sourced ingredients and coastal traditions shape menus designed for convivial dining.

Elsewhere, the Aman Spa and Wellness centre offers a 660 square metre (7,105 square foot) sanctuary for restoration, inspired by the elemental harmony of land, ocean and sky. Featuring six private treatment rooms, two signature Hydro Houses with banya and hammam, a 24-hour Fitness Centre and a contemporary *Temazcal* (sweat lodge), it offers quiet transformation.

From duneside stargazing to morning rides through the sierra and private encounters with local farmers, fishermen and artisans, experiences at Amanvari are shaped to the season and the individual. Beyond the resort, Amanvari forms part of the exclusive Costa Palmas community, a 1,500-acre private estate offering access to miles of swimmable beach, a marina, golf course and organic farm. The surrounding East Cape invites exploration, from snorkelling in the protected reefs of Cabo Pulmo National Park to sailing, hiking and horseback riding across desert landscapes.

A secluded coastal sanctuary where desert, mountains and sea converge, the resort brings Aman's hallmarks of peace and privacy design to one of Mexico's most untouched regions, overlooking the shifting blues of the Sea of Cortés and enveloped by the peaks of the Sierra de la Laguna mountains.

Designed by Heah & Co. and realised by Elastic Architects, Amanvari is shaped by its extraordinary natural setting with structures that merge seamlessly into their surrounds, including elevated pavilions and open-air spaces framing uninterrupted views of horizon and sky. Organic and contemporary in aesthetic, Aman's design DNA blends white concrete, natural stone and local hardwoods, enriched by bespoke ceramics and original artworks crafted by Mexican artisans.

Either ensconced by palm groves, overlooking the estuary or facing the open sea, Amanvari's 18 casitas are thoughtfully placed to ensure privacy and immersion in nature. Each features expansive terraces, outdoor fireplaces, private pools and seamless transitions between interior and exterior living spaces. Meanwhile, inside, calm, light-filled spaces echo the tones of the landscape, creating retreats deeply grounded in place. Stays are further enhanced by a considered range of inclusions, from daily breakfast and in-room refreshments to the use of non-motorised water sports equipment and bicycles, alongside bespoke itinerary planning tailored to each guest.

At the heart of the resort, Casa Grande serves as the resort's open-air atrium and central hub. Here, a collection of dining venues celebrates both global and local culinary traditions, from Italian harvest cuisine at signature venue, Arva, to Japanese omakase at Sesui. The oceanfront beach club, Luma, offers Baja-inspired dishes showcasing fresh seafood and seasonal produce, while the panoramic pool provides a laidback setting for all-day dining and sunset gatherings.

Meanwhile, the 660-square-metre (over 7,000-square-foot) Aman Spa and Wellness centre embraces a holistic offering rooted in Mexico's ancestral wisdom and rituals of healing. Featuring six private treatment rooms, two signature Hydro Houses with banya and hammam, a 24-hour Fitness Centre and a contemporary *Temazcal* (sweat lodge), it offers quiet transformation where the body purifies and the mind releases.

Curated experiences, from duneside stargazing to dawn rides through the Sierra de la Laguna and private breakfasts on the sand are enriched by the knowledge of local experts, while bespoke itineraries are informed by the seasons, and preferences.

Beyond the resort itself, Amanvari forms part of the exclusive Costa Palmas community, a 1,500-acre private estate offering access to three miles of swimmable beach, a marina, yacht club, Robert Trent Jones II-designed golf course, organic farms and orchards. The surrounding East Cape invites exploration, from snorkelling in the protected reefs of Cabo Pulmo National Park to sailing, hiking and horseback riding across desert landscapes. Defined by its profound sense of place, Aman's first Mexican sanctuary offers a base for boundless discovery, less than an hour from San José del Cabo International Airport (SJD).
