Framed by jungle and rice terraces in Bali's cultural heartland, Amandari invites guests to discover the island's soul. Alang-alang thatched houses – some with pools, all with private tropical gardens – offer pavilions elegantly decorated with teak and coconut wood. The sacred grounds host dance classes and religious processions, leading to a 7th-century stone tiger, a motif repeated throughout the property.

#### LOCATION

- Amandari lies in the village of Kedewatan, part of Bali's cultural capital, Ubud, which is a 10-minute drive away
- Hidden on a hillside overlooking rice terraces and the wilderness of the Ayung Valley

#### GETTING THERE

- Around 1.5-hours drive north of Denpasar's I Gusti Ngurah Rai International Airport (DPS)
- The airport (DPS) is served by carriers including Singapore Airlines, Garuda Indonesia, Qatar Airways, Emirates, Qantas Airways, Turkish Airlines, KLM Airlines, Korean Air, Cathay Pacific, Thai Airways, Malaysia Airlines, Scoot and Jetstar
- The complimentary car transfers from airport to the resorts
- Cars are equipped with Wi-Fi, refreshments, snacks and the Amandari Experience Guide

## Accommodation

Situated near Ubud and surrounded by traditional paras-stone walls, each of the freestanding pavilions and villas is accessed through a traditional Balinese stone gateway. Amandari's thatched-roof pavilions open on three sides via sliding glass doors to lush garden courtyards and feature coconut and teak wood accents.

AMANDARI THREE-BEDROOM VILLA

- One-minute drive from the resort, with private entrance
- Fully private Balinese-style compound with five pavilions
- Views of Ayung River Valley, rice fields and tropical foliage
- Two dedicated butlers throughout the stay
- Expansive 14-metre two-tier swimming pool with pale green tiles
- Each bedroom features a canopied king-size bed and a bathroom with sunken marble bathtub and twin vanities
- Separate glass-walled living room and open-air dining balé



## Dining

Exposed to cooling mountain breezes, the open-air main restaurant and adjacent bar enjoy spectacular views of the main Amandari pool and the Ayung River Valley.

### THE RESTAURANT

- 50 seats in the lower-level area
- Open for breakfast, lunch, dinner and wine tasting
- Serves Indonesian, Balinese, and international cuisine
- Provides alfresco seating which overlooks the main swimming pool

### TERRACE BAR

- Seats 22 guests
- Located opposite The Restaurant
- Ideal spot for refreshing drinks and sundowners
- Ranging from snacks, light meals, light beverages, soft drinks, juices, mocktails, cocktails, liquors, spirits, wines and selections of cigars
- Overlooks the main swimming pool

### DINING BALÉ

- Two open-air dining balés, each with four seats
- Open for breakfast, lunch and dinner
- Provides alfresco seating overlooking the Ayung valley and mountains on the horizon

### LOTUS POND PAVILION

- Available for dinner for up to eight seats
- Open and intimate environment, surrounded by a small lotus pond
- Reservation required

### LIBRARY
