A veritable Eden in the Flores Sea. Overlooking the turquoise waters of Amanwana Bay, a National Park, this wilderness hideaway offers unparalleled access to some of the best scuba diving and snorkelling in Indonesia. Here in this wildlife lover's paradise, Amanwana has set up camp, with 17 safari tents amid the rainforest or on the shore.

LOCATION

- Moyo Island lies just east of Bali, facing Sumbawa Island, at the western end of the Nusa Tenggara archipelago
- Amanwana is tucked into a secluded cove on the island's west coast, looking out to the Flores Sea

GETTING THERE

- Travel by air to Sultan Muhammad Kaharuddin III Airport (SWQ) at Sumbawa Besar, then travel 50 minutes by boat from Badas Harbour to Moyo Island
- A private charter plane can be arranged and provided by CeoJetset Departing from Bali, Ngurah Rai International Airport (DPS), to Sumbawa Besar, Sultan Muhammad Kaharuddin III Airport (SWQ)
- Partnering with Fly Bali, a private helicopter departing from Bali directly to Amanwana resort ground on Moyo Island can also be arranged

COMPLIMENTARY INCLUSIONS

- Return car and boat transfer from Sumbawa Besar's Sultan Muhammad Kaharuddin III Airport (SWQ) to Moyo Island
- Breakfast, lunch and dinner with soft beverages
- Wireless broadband internet access included in all public areas
- Laundry (five pieces per guest per day)
- Paddleboarding, kayaking and snorkelling around Amanwana Beach (weather permitting)
- Use of mountain bicycles and trekking poles
- Marshmallows at sunset for children under 12



Accommodation

Backed by the lush jungle foliage of a national park on the shores of the Flores Sea, Amanwana's permanent tented suites pair a wilderness experience with modern luxury. Under a canopy of tropical forest, the camp's 17 safari-style tents have elegant décor, an array of local Indonesian art and all the 21st-century comforts one could need.

- Nestled just beyond the shoreline
- Framing a direct outlook over Amanwana Bay and the Flores Sea
- A short stroll to the sands of Amanwana Beach
- Solid foundation with wooden walls, picture windows and wooden decks
- Canvas ceilings with a separate waterproof exterior layer
- Daybeds and spacious writing desk
- Outdoor sitting area
- Large bathroom providing separate shower room



Dining

- View of the Flores Sea
- Serves daily fresh and simple cuisine, much of it made with products grown in chef's organic garden or reared on the island

- Set near the Amanwana beach
- Serving canapés and refreshments

PRIVATE DINING

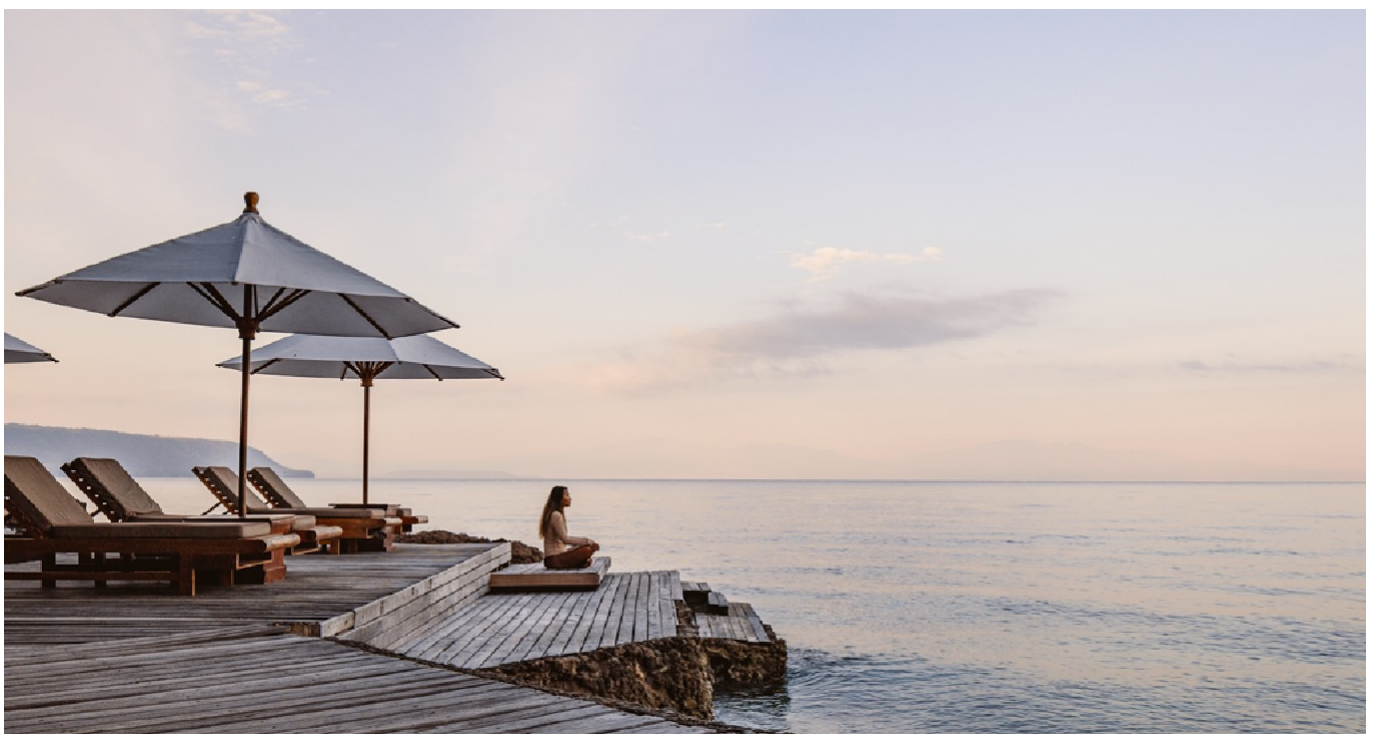

Experiences

Surrounded by abundant wildlife, Amanwana offers a multitude of ways to explore its pristine natural setting, both on land and at sea.

WHALE SHARK EXCURSION

Located just east of Moyo Island, Saleh Bay is known as the home of the second-largest whale shark (*Rhincodon typus*) population in Indonesia with at least 99 known to inhabit its waters year-round. UNESCO also recognised the presence of whale sharks in the bay, having added the area to its Biosphere Reserve list in 2019. In the presence of an experienced guide from Konservasi Indonesia – a non-profit organisation leading conservation in the area – guests can experience these magnificent creatures first-hand and learn how to protect their future.

WATERFALL EXCURSION

Comprising a series of cascading limestone pools, Barry's Falls is located in the centre of Moyo Island. Named after Amanwana's resident naturalist, Barry Lees, who discovered Amanwana Bay, and in turn found this beautiful waterfall in the early 1990s, Barry's Falls is also known as Mata Jitu Waterfall. Its crystal-clear water provides an opportunity for a refreshing dip in its limestone pools – an experience to cherish.

DINING

Our breathtaking inner and outer reefs boast a plethora of dive sites, all with pristine coral species and a vast variety of marine life. See hawksbill and green sea turtles, moray eels, lionfish and more in Amanwana Bay or discover myriad sites on three large reefs close to Labuan Aji, just a 10- to 15-minute boat ride from Amanwana. Several corals date back over a century, making these reefs some of the best preserved in the world.

CRUISING

Much of what enthrals guests during a stay at Amanwana is the ability to completely unwind on a leisurely cruise, taking in the best that nature has to offer. Three private vessels provide the opportunity to venture out to the vast sea for either a sunset or starlight voyage.



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
